

# Memorandum of Understanding between Japan Veterinary Medical Association, Korean Veterinary Medical Association and Taiwan Veterinary Medical Association

## Section I

### Purpose and Principles

A. The purpose of this Memorandum of Understanding (“MOU”) is to express the Participants intent to cooperate trilateral and improve the standard of veterinary medicine to win international support and to embody the view of Fukuoka Memorandum, which was signed by four associations of World Veterinary Association, World Medical Association, Japan Medical Association and Japan Veterinary Medical Association in 2016, in Kitakyushu-city, Fukuoka prefecture for promoting “One Health.” This is a non-binding MOU and nothing in it is intended to create legal obligations under international or other law.

B. The Participants expect the cooperation provided for in this MOU to enhance technique of veterinary, to promote standard of veterinary medical education and concern for the care and welfare of animals.

## Section II

### Informing Sharing

The Participants intend to exchange the following:

1. veterinarians
2. veterinary students

## Section III

### Regular Cooperation

The Participants attend one’s veterinary medical conference each year in rotation.

A meeting for opinion-exchanging among the three Participants or a cooperative program by the three Participants will be held in the veterinary medical conference of each country.


The expense of registration fee will be negotiated by participants. Each country will provide 2 rooms for 3 nights complimentary accommodations for each country per year.

## Section IV

### Final Provisions

This MOU is to come into operation upon Signature by the Participants, and should continue for three years from that date. The Participants may decide in writing to extend this MOU for additional three-year terms.

Signed at Kaohsiung Taiwan, in triplicate, on January 6<sup>th</sup> 2018, in English language.




